Alison had just turned 18 when she lost her sight in a shocking workplace accident. Today, with the help of a gorgeous Seeing Eye Dog named Ashton she has her life back on track.

Alison and Ashton bonded so well that they are known as 'The A Team' and have gone from strength to strength since being matched.

Alison says, 'We grow closer every day; we take everything in our stride and overcome challenges as a team.'

Having Ashton in her life has gifted Alison a world of new opportunities. With the increased mobility and confidence Ashton has given her, Alison is pursuing her dreams of working in the health sector and is now studying a Diploma of Health Science at Griffith University.

'There have been many challenges in navigating a new area though Ashton has taken all of it in his stride. It has been a big learning curve for both of us. But we face the challenges and unknowns together as one,' Alison said.

Last year, Alison and Ashton had the honour of being Baton Bearers in the Queen's Baton Relay for the Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast. Their moment in the spotlight was one they'll never forget.

Of the special day, Alison says, 'The feeling was phenomenal. It was an adrenaline rush for the both of us. Ashton was as excited as I was. He strutted his stuff in front of the crowd and cameras. I will forever cherish that once-in-alifetime experience. Having my best mate Ashton sharing that moment with me was very special.'

Alison has nothing but the highest praise for the Ashton who changed her life.

'Ashton is a real character with a massive heart, he makes me chuckle. He loves to relax, work hard and play hard. It seems as though nothing is too big or too small for him. He is up for anything.'


Look at me go! I am learning to walk in perfect position with my carer. It takes a lot of training and treats to get this right.

Stairs can be a bit tricky for a pup like me! I need lots of practice so I can be confident and calm when my human needs to navigate the stairs.




My table manners are impeccable. know to wait for my carer to blow the whistle three times, which is my signal to eat. Yum!

Ushering in a new life

Adam lives his life without limits, and with Usher his Seeing Eye Dog by his side, he knows he can achieve anything.

A rare eye condition took Adam's sight in his left eye at the age of 17, and by the time he was 22, he had also lost the vision in his other eye. Undeniably this was really hard for Adam to deal with. As a result he shut himself away from the world. He says,

'I put on a lot of weight due to the isolation and depression. I was in a bit of a rut.'

But a fluffy, cheeky pup helped Adam turn his life around.

'After many years, I finally received the best gift of all and the catalyst to take control of my life - Usher my Seeing Eye Dog.'

Usher's skills and companionship opened up the world again to Adam and bit by bit, he regained his confidence and independence.

'Usher's very adaptable to all environments which surprised me. Even in places we've never been before, I can give him commands and he reacts

as he should. He knows where we are and where we want to be. He certainly streamlines travel for me, and definitely makes me feel safer in noisy, difficult areas.'

With Usher by his side, Adam turned his life around. He completed his diploma in remedial massage, graduating at the top of his class, and found a new direction in life. He joined a gym, lost 38kg, and has travelled around the world.

Adam has now completed over one hundred races and fun runs, including five marathons and four obstacle races! Usher doesn't run marathons, but he does get plenty of exercise anyway.

'Usher runs with me during training, and we go to and from the gym together, but it's not reasonable to expect Usher to run a marathon with me!'

It's clear that Usher has made a big impact on Adam's physical and mental health.

'After a difficult start and many years of not having any direction in life, I've finally found something that I truly love.'

And it's all thanks to one gorgeous dog named Usher.


